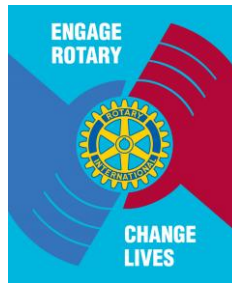

Meetings

3rd March – Normal Meeting followed by Council

Rtn Brenda advised that the new Community Fundraiser (Cheryl) from the Children's Hospital will be attending next weeks' meeting. The idea is to see how her work and our VVR can run in tandem and maximise on the publicity. It is hoped that VP Rtn Peter will be present and he can present a cheque for monies already in the bank from his 'scrap metal donation pledge'.

Rtn Anne W asked if the Snowflake had been paid for. The club had a letter from the hospital regarding non-payment, and a reply went back saying that we had – nothing has been heard since.

Rtn Peter P mentioned the flood appeal and asked whether the club was going to send a donation. This will be discussed at tonight's council meeting after the club meeting.

Rtn John H – advised that he needs a cheque for £300 for the upcoming Disability Games.

That being the end of the business, the meeting closed with the usual toast.

10th March– Normal Meeting with Speaker

Good turn out again last night. Our guest speaker was Cheryl from The Children's Hospital Charity. Vice President Peter presented a cheque, in excess of £1,000, to her from the proceeds of his 'Scrap Collection' incentive. This financial year the charity needs to raise £2.4m. It is already at £2.3m, so, with just this month to go £.1m is needed and it is believed it will be done. Wortley's cheque will

certainly help. Well done to Peter for this initiative.

17th March – Normal Meeting

President David welcomed members to the meeting (no guests tonight).

Rtn Rod advised that he had attended RC of Barnsley Rockley's Sports evening fundraising event – no greetings were exchanged.

President David advised that Rtn Peter C was attending RC of Sheffield's meeting to promote the Scrap Metal initiative. He also mentioned that there had been a piece on Radio Sheffield promoting Music in the Gardens.

Rtn Graham (Sec) informed that meeting that subject to other more pressing engagements, he has booked 2 Police Horses to attend the VVR.

Club Project

President David advised that he has an idea for a Club Project. He currently has a boat (which he bought a number of years ago), which doesn't float anymore after the recent storms. He is intending to donate it to Montenevy School for the children to play on and is looking for help from the club to do this – making it safe for children, positioning it in the school grounds etc. He envisages that it would be adorned with Rotary stuff detailing where it has come from etc, and will be looking for volunteers to help

with this – particularly when it comes to moving and siting it in the designated location.

We still need helpers for the upcoming Disability Games on 30th March. Rtn Rod advised that parking is free in Barnsley on Sundays. Volunteers are required to act as Admin Co-ordinators and Fixture Co-ordinators. There are approaching 100 competitors registered to play.

Rtn Barrie reminded the meeting that Maureen Greaves will be the visiting speaker on March 31st and will be talking about the food bank. Who Am I

- 1) I was born on 15th June, 1914 in Nagutskaya in the Russian Empire. My father was a Railway Official, and my mother was the adopted daughter of a Moscow watchmaker who originated from Finland. Both my parents were dead by the time I was 13. As a teenager, I worked for the

Volga steamship line, doing a number of different jobs. I was educated at Rybinsk Water Transport College graduating in 1936.

- 2) Aged 16, I became full-time secretary of the Young Communist League (YCL) at the school in Rybinsk. In 1938, I became First Secretary of the Yaroslavl Regional Committee of the YCL, and from 1940-44, was First Secretary of the Central Committee of Komsomol in the Soviet Karelo-Finnish Republic. During WWII, I took part in partisan guerrilla activities in Finland. After the war, I was elected Second Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Karelo-Finnish SSR.

- 3) My political progress continued onwards, and in 1954, I was appointed Soviet Ambassador in Hungary, being in that position during the 1956 uprising. I convinced Khrushchev to intervene militarily, but what I saw in the build up to the military intervention made me believe that only armed force could ensure the survival of our one-party state - such as I supported in Czechoslovakia in 1968. In 1957, I returned to Moscow, where I headed the Department for Liaison with Communist and Workers' Parties in Socialist Countries for 10 years. In 1967, I became head of the KGB and a Candidate Member of the Politburo, being promoted to full member of the latter in 1973.

- 4) I played a dominant role in the decision to invade Afghanistan in 1979, and was also the longest serving KGB chairman. I opposed plans to occupy Poland after the emergence of the Solidarity movement, and promoted a number of reform minded people, including a certain Mikhail Gorbachev. I resigned as KGB head in May 1982 when I was

promoted to the Secretariat, becoming secretary responsible for ideological affairs. On the death of Leonid Brezhnev, in November 1982, I was elected General Secretary. The first former head of the KGB to be elevated to the post.

- 5) During my leadership, I began to fight violations of party, state and labour discipline, dismissing 18 ministers, 37 first-secretaries of obkoms, kraikoms and Central Committees, and criminal cases against party and state officials were started. I effectively anointed Gorbachev as my successor in the build up to my death which occurred on 9th February, 1984 at the age of 69. I was however succeeded by Konstantin Chernenko, although Gorbachev succeeded him 13 months later.
