### Who Am I

1. I was born on 7<sup>th</sup> August 1924 in India where my father worked as a mining engineer. I was brought up in Cornwall from the age of 10, and educated at Felsted School, Essex and Corpus Christi College, Oxford, where I read Modern Languages. I was a schoolmaster and a captain in the Coldstream Guards during WWII, being injured on D-Day.
2. In 1948, I joined the BBC as a radio newsreader, transferring to TV in 1954. I was in fact the first to appear in front of a camera reading the news a year later. At the same time, I worked as an actor, and briefly worked for Austin reed in Regent Street.
3. From 1961-1969, I worked as a freelance newsreader, working occasionally for ITV and presented Southern TVs Day by Day” programme. I also appeared in “2001: A Space Odyssey” as a Newsreader, and the Doctor Who serial “The War Machines”. I re-joined the BBC in 1969, and read the news regularly until 1981. I was one of the newsreaders who appeared in the famous Morecambe and Wise sketch (Christmas 1977).

4. After retiring from News Reading, I voiced the BBC Micro hardware speech synthesis system as part of Acorn Computers. I also presented “Songs of Praise”, and Channel Four’s “Treasure Hunt”. I took part in the BBC programme “The Young Ones” in 2010 where people in their 70s and 80s deal with problems of ageing by looking back to the 1970s.
5. I lived in Cowes on the Isle-of-Wight with my partner of 23 years – we entered a Civil Partnership in 2006 (after 17 years together). I owned a Marine Art Gallery and was also a keen beekeeper. I died on 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2012 following a stroke. Five months after I died, my partner committed suicide.
