#### Who Am I

- 1. I was born in King's Heath, Birmingham on 7<sup>th</sup> October, 1938. My father worked for motorbike and paint companies, and my mother helped out in the family printing business. Both represented England at table tennis. My father was the English Number 1 and played at World Championships between 1928 and 1953. I followed my parents and played in 5 World Championships in the 1950s. I played for the senior England Team when aged 15)
- 2. I also began playing the sport for which I am better known when aged 13. And competed in the British Junior championships a year later. I won the British Junior Titles in 1954 and 55. A year later, I won the girls championships at one of the major World events.
- 3. In 1961, I won my first Major title, and reached the final of another major, only losing to the defending champion. In 1962, I got married. Two years later, I suffered a back and neck injury which hampered my career for a couple of years, but I still managed to reach the latter stages of a couple of majors. The following year, I won my second major title, and the following year lost in 2 finals.
- 4. Two years later, I gained my revenge for the 2 major defeats in 1967, when I won the Women's Singles Title at Wimbledon, defeating Billie Jean King in the Final for my 3<sup>rd</sup> Major Title prize money was £1,500. I also won the Mixed Doubles Title that year with Fred Stolle, and was voted BBC Sports Personality of the Year. In 1970, the BBC hired me as a guest commentator, and I

worked with them for the next 3 decades. I was chair of the Women's International Tennis Council, and British Team captain for Fed and Wightman Cups. During my career, I won 113 Singles Titles.

5. I published my autobiography "A Game to Love" in 1971. In 1985, I was voted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame and have been a member of Wimbledon's Committee of Management. In 1993, My husband, with whom I had 3 children, died. I became the first non-Royal to present a trophy at Wimbledon in 2007. In 2014, I received a CBE for services to Tennis. In 2017, I became a vice president of the All England Club.
