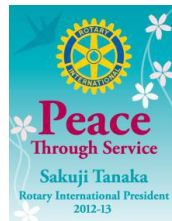

Meetings

5th November – Normal Meeting followed by Council.

President Steve welcomed a guest from Hallam Rotary Club who brought greetings from their President and Club, and was asked to convey the same back.

There was no vote on the proposed District Re-organisation at the District meeting last week.

The Millionaires night, which the club is getting involved in (January 2013), was mentioned – there is a need for as many people as possible to get involved.

Further to the discussions last month regarding Abi (Bradfield School) and the donation for her trip next year, a donation has been made for the purposes of allowing the club to help fund the trip.

Ryegate Children's Hospital Appeal

Rtn Brenda reported that the project has now started. Recent contributions to the fund include £500 from Barnsley Rockley, Brenda held a Home Candle event which raised a£100. The total raised now stands at £2,620. We had intended to raise £6,000 this year, but the VVR cancellation affected this quite dramatically. Brenda advised that there is a Box at the Arena for the One Direction concert which will be auctioned off at the HSBC Ball.

The speaker at the meeting was Fay Wilson the fund raising manager of TCAA (The Children's Air Ambulance). She told us the organisation was brand new, launched only last month and will be operational early 2013. The TCAA is the first dedicated service of its kind in the UK and is expected to be in high demand from the very start. It is a free service that relies totally on voluntary donations.

The Air Ambulance will be based at Coventry airport and will be able to respond very quickly to emergencies for example Coventry to say Barnsley in 15 minutes! Its main aim is to transfer children from hospital to a dedicated Paediatric Centre in a fraction of the time it would take by road and hopefully save lives.

A vote of thanks was given by the President.

Who Am I

1. I was born on 6th February 1933 in West Bridgford, Nottingham – the son of an actor from his second

marriage. When I was 11 years old, my parents moved to London, but I was then evacuated to Bute until the war ended.

2. As a youngster, I showed promise as a pianist and won a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music. I attended the Cone-Ripman Drama School where I met my future wife. Aged 16, I appeared on Radio Luxembourg as a member of the Oultineys Concert Party. My parents died within 5 years of each other, my father's death in 1955 occurring 10 days after being hit by a car.
3. The year before my Dad's death, I married my wife, and we had 5 children (1 Son, AND 4 Daughters). During the 50s and 60s I worked on stage and Radio including Variety Playhouse, and Oultine Radio programmes. At the same time, my TV career was beginning to take off, as I presented programmes such as The Billy Cotton Band Show, and Crackerjack for most of the 1960s. I supported West Bromwich Albion Football Club.
4. I then graduated in Gameshows, being the original host of "The Price is Right" with the catchphrase 'Come on Down'. In 1990, after the axing of TPIR, I was chosen to be the host of "Stars in their Eyes". I was an Alcoholic, like my father, and after turning up at a gala in Glastonbury in a drunken stupor, received treatment and never drank again.
5. My showbusiness career was effectively ended by a car crash on the M5 in October 1992, and I was in a coma for 17 days afterwards. I was awarded a CBE in the 1993 New

Year's Honours List, and appeared on the Royal Variety Performance later that year, but retired from Showbusiness in November 1994. I died from Heart failure on 29th September 1996.
