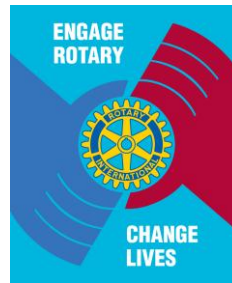

Who Am I

- 1) I was born on 1st March, 1910 in London to parents of French (mother), and Scottish (father) descent. My father was killed at Gallipoli during WWI. My mother married again in 1917. I had 3 older siblings, the eldest of whom was born in Switzerland.
- 2) I attended private school at Heatherdown and Stowe, before attending Sandhurst, graduating in 1930 as a 2nd Lieutenant in the regular Army. I requested assignment to the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders or the Black, but was placed with the

Highland Light Infantry. I served for 2 years in Malta and then for a few months in Dover. By now, I was becoming tired of service in a peacetime army, and resigned by telegram whilst crossing the Atlantic in 1933 after being allowed to escape from close-arrest. I moved to New York City, and ended up in Hollywood via Bermuda and Cuba in 1934.

- 3) Having finally obtained a resident Alien Visa, I began to get low grade acting jobs. Eventually, my role in "Mutiny on the Bounty" attracted the attention of Samuel Goldwyn, who signed me and established me in the profession. My supporting roles during this time included films "The Prisoner of Zenda" and "The Charge of the Light Brigade", before gaining leading roles in "Wuthering Heights" opposite Errol Flynn, Loretta Young and Laurence Olivier, and as a co-star with Ginger Rogers in "Bachelor Mother"
- 4) When WWII started, I returned to England and rejoined the Army as a lieutenant in the Rifle Brigade. I then transferred to the Commandos. I commanded GHQ Liaison Regiment, and worked with the Army Film Unit acting in 2 films during the war, the second one of these being "The Way Ahead" in 1944. I also took part in the Normandy invasion, though not the D-Day landings. I ended the war as a Lieutenant-Colonel, and received the Legion of Merit from Dwight Eisenhower. After the War ended, I resumed my acting career.
- 5) By now, I was appearing in starring roles only, such as in "The Bishop's Wife" in 1947. I became estranged

from Goldwyn due to a problem over the film "The Elusive Pimpernel" which led to me being effectively barred from the Hollywood studios. I won the Best Actor Oscar in 1958 for my role in "Separate Tables", and was co-host of 3 Academy Awards ceremonies. I had my own TV show which ran for 13 years from 1959, and appeared in another 30 films, such as "The Guns of Navarone" in 1961, "The Pink Panther" in 1963, and "Death on the Nile" in 1980. I also wrote 4 books. I was married twice during my life, having 4 children, and died on 29th July, 1983 of ALS in Switzerland.
