## REMEMBER THE 4-WAY TEST

- 1) **Is it the TRUTH?**
- 2) **Is it fair to all concerned?**
- 3) **Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- 4) **Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?**

### Who Am I

1. I was born on 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 1929 in Moscow. My family were industrial workers. Aged 12, I had to work in a factory to support the war effort, and was sent to work in a military factory in Moscow. I was spotted playing football for the factory team and invited to join the Dynamo Moscow team.
2. I made my debut in 1950 in a friendly match, but played only 2 games, and then did not appear in a senior match for the next couple of seasons. I however remained at Dynamo trying to break into the senior squad. I also played for the Ice Hockey team and managed to win the USSR Ice Hockey cup in 1953.
3. I broke into the senior squad in 1953, and the following year, was called up by the national team. I helped them win the 1956 Summer Olympic title as well as the inaugural European Football Championships in 1960. 2 years earlier, I helped the USSR team reach

the quarter-finals, where my performance in goal against Brazil stopped the scoreline from being a rout – Brazil won 2-0. I was selected in the All-Star team for the tournament.

4. I was nominated for Ballon d'Or in 1960 and 61, where I finished 5<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. I led my country to the World Cup quarter-finals again in 1962, despite suffering 2 concussions during the tournament. One of my best performances came the following year in a match between England and the Rest of the World. I became known as the "Black Spider" because I wore an all black outfit My fans called me the fearless "Black Panther". In 1966, I led my country to finish 4<sup>th</sup> at the World Cup. In 1970, I travelled to the World Cup for the 4<sup>th</sup> time as third-choice backup and an Assistant Coach – we made the quarter-finals again.
5. The following year (1971), I played my final game for Dynamo Moscow. My testimonial game was played in front of 100,000 fans at the Lenin Stadium, Moscow. Amongst those playing were Pele, Eusebio and Franz Beckenbauer. After I retired, I held various Admin positions at Dynamo Moscow, and a Bronze Statue was erected at the Dynamo Moscow stadium. I had one of my legs amputated after contracting thrombophlebitis in Budapest in 1986. I died on 20<sup>th</sup> March, 1990 from Stomach Cancer – I was given a state funeral as a Soviet Honoured Master of Sport. In 1994, FIFA established an award for the best goalkeeper in the World Cup which they named after me.


