### Who Am I

- 1) I was born in Helensburgh, Dunbartonshire on 13<sup>th</sup> August, 1888. My father was a Church Minister, and I had an older brother and two older sisters.
- 2) Whilst at school, I demonstrated a keen interest in science and technology. When I was 12, I made a telephone, and connected it up to the homes of 4 of my friends. A year later, I built a generator to light the house. I attended Glasgow University as a final year BSc student but WWI intervened and I did not take the final exams.
- 3) When WWI started, I tried to join the army, but was declared unfit. I then went into business, selling medicines, before going to Trinidad and starting a factory making jam and pickles. I also sold fertilizer, medicated socks and soap.
- 4) In the 1920's, I invented a device that would have a major impact on the world of communication. Although my own work was destroyed by a fire in London in 1936, my idea took off and led to the creation of the first regular Television service in 1937.
- 5) After WWII, I was asked to help plan the use of Television, and most of my ideas are now being developed (3-D, HD, Big Screen

## This Month's Joke

### SCIENTISTS DISCOVER NEW ELEMENT (and the truth?)

... Oxford University researchers have discovered the heaviest element yet known to science. The new element, Governmentium (symbol=Gv), has one neutron, 25 assistant neutrons, 88 deputy neutrons and 198 assistant deputy neutrons, giving it an atomic mass of 312.

These 312 particles are held together by forces called morons, which are surrounded by vast quantities of lepton-like particles called pillocks.

Since Governmentium has no electrons, it is inert. However, it can be detected, because it impedes every reaction with which it comes into contact.

A tiny amount of Governmentium can cause a reaction that would normally take less than a second, to take from 4 days to 4 years to complete. Governmentium has a normal half-life of 2 to 6 years. It does not decay, but instead undergoes a reorganisation in which a portion of the assistant neutrons and deputy neutrons exchange places.

In fact, Governmentium's mass will actually increase over time, since each reorganisation will cause more morons to become neutrons, forming isodopes. This characteristic of moron promotion leads some scientists to believe that Governmentium is formed whenever morons reach a critical concentration. This hypothetical quantity is referred to as a critical morass. When catalysed with money, Governmentium becomes Administratium (symbol=Ad), an element that radiates just as much energy as Governmentium, since it has half as many pillocks but twice as many morons.
