As a result of this, I was given a Broadcasting Trial in autumn 1947. I then did my first live commentary two months later, and the following year, commentated on the Grand National for BBC Radio. In 1950, I left the Press Association and joined the Daily Express. I married a year later to a former model. I also became a racehorse owner, and by 1960, I had owned over 20 horses.

In 1965, I bought a yearling colt for 2,800 guineas and called it “Be Friendly”. This horse became the Champion Sprinter of Europe winning 12 races. I was awarded an OBE in 1977, and a CBE in 1991. I was elected a member of the Jockey Club in 1986.

Who Am I

1. I was born on 3rd March, 1918 in Kenmare, County Kerry, the only child of the resident magistrate at Killarney. My parents separated in the early 1920s, and I was brought up in Surrey by my maternal grandparents. I was educated at Hawtreys, Charterhouse, and College Alpin International Beau Soleil in Switzerland.

5) As my career in journalism drew to a close, I involved myself in charitable work, notably in horse welfare. This culminated in 1999 when I established my own charitable trust, raising over £3m for six animal-related charities. I retired from broadcasting in 1997, and was awarded a knighthood. I

died, after a battle with cancer, on 29th July, 2015.
