Who Am I

1. I was born on 19th April 1970, the daughter of a car mechanic. I grew up in Kent, attending Hildenborough Comprehensive school at the age of 12. At the same time, I began to take an

- interest in Athletics, joining Tonbridge Athletics Club. I won the English Schools 1500 metres in 1983.
2. I left school at 16, and worked as an assistant in a sweet shop, and as a nursing assistant for disabled people. When I was 18, I joined the British Army, where I was initially a lorry driver in the Women's Royal Army Corps before becoming a PT instructor.
 3. In 1990, I started a course within the army structure which led to me becoming a Sergeant Class 1 PTI. I also became British Army Judo champion and competed in Army Athletics meetings. After watching the 1992 Olympics, I decided to return to Athletics. I won a Silver and Bronze Medal at the World Championships in 1995, but following injuries failed to win a medal in Atlanta in 1996. My Athletics career continued to blossom as I won Silver at the 1998 Commonwealth Games, and a Bronze Medal in Sydney in 2000. I was awarded an MBE in 1998 for services to the British Army.
 4. In 2002, I won the 1500 metres in the Commonwealth Games in Manchester, and a bronze medal at the European Championships the same year. The following year, I won Silver at the World Championships. All this culminated with me winning double Gold at the Athens Olympics in 2004 in the 800 and 1500 metres. I carried the flag at the Closing Ceremony, and won the BBC Sports Personality that December.
 5. I was made a Dame in 2005, retiring from Athletics the same

year. In 2008, I founded a trust to help support young athletes and help young people all across the UK. I succeeded Sir Chris Chataway as President of Commonwealth Games England, and was inducted into the English Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010. I have appeared on a number of TV shows such as "The Cube" and "Bear Grylls: Mission Survive".
