		<b><u>Who Am I</u></b>	
		1. I was born on 4 <sup>th</sup> February 1919 in Bramhall, Cheshire, the son of a Bank Official. I went to Denston College in Uttoxeter. After finishing school, I joined the Fleet Air Arm, and qualified as a pilot. When the Second World War started, I served as a lieutenant, and was shot down by an ME109 whilst flying a Fairey Albacore, and made a forced landing on a Dutch island. I was captured and became a POW.	
		2. In 1941, I escaped only to be recaptured 3 days later by a member of the Hitler Youth. I	



was sent to Stalag Luft III, the scene of "The Great Escape", where I met Talbot Rothwell, who major effect on my life came after the War. I was one of the vaulters covering for the escape portrayed in the book and film "The Wooden Horse". I sang a duet with Rothwell, and did some comic repartee, which helped cover up the noise of the escape. Also at the same camp were Stratford Johns and John Casson, who remained friends after the war ended.

3. After the War, I began to forge a career in showbusiness, coming to notice after appearing in panto around the UK. My first film appearance was in the Val Guest film "William Comes to Town (1948), and we worked on a further 7 films during our careers. I also met and married my wife, Janet Brown, with whom I had a son and daughter. My first major success came in the TV show "How do you view?" in which I played the Chauffeur "Lockitt". I also presented children's TV programmes in the 50s including Whirligig". I also took minor parts in films appearing alongside Sean Connery, David Niven and Douglas Fairbanks Jr. In the mid 60s, I appeared in Dr Who alongside William Hartnell, playing the Meddling Monk.
4. Also in 1965, my earlier association with Talbot Rothwell led me to getting a part in "Carry on Cowboy". In all, I appeared in 16 of these films, being the 6<sup>th</sup> most prolific performer. I usually played characters who were quiet, eccentric or stooges – for example, in "Don't lose your Head, I played Citizen Bidet, and in Carry on Camping, I played the Camp Site Manager who charged everyone £1 for everything and anything. Into the 1970s, as well as the Carry On films, I appeared in "A Funny Thing happened on the Way to the Forum" (1966) and "Robin and Marian" (1976), the latter with Sean Connery, Richard Harris and Audrey Hepburn.
5. In 1975, I was the subject of "This is your Life", being surprised whilst shopping with my wife in Selfridges store in London. When the Carry On films finished in 1978, I appeared in "The First Great Train Robbery"(1979) with Sean Connery and the Alan Bennett play "Afternoon Off" (1979) – both of these were shown posthumously. Whilst starring as Widow Twankey in Aladdin at the Coventry Theatre, I was found dead in my hotel room

on 16<sup>th</sup> January 1979 when I didn't turn up for the matinee performance.
